



Strong Second Half Leads Tigers to Victory!!

This past Friday night the Jesuit football team travelled to the historic Abe Brown field to take on the Middleton Tigers in a district showdown that had huge implications on the playoff scenario. The Jesuit Tigers needed a win to maintain a shot at the runner up spot for the district. The Jesuit Tigers scored first on a Bobby Eveld touchdown pass to Ben Gutowski of twelve yards in the first quarter. In the second quarter Robby Garcia had a one yard touchdown run highlighting a huge performance by him with twenty six carries for 153 yards on the ground. The Tigers defense held Middleton to ten first half points and only seventeen for the game with two fumble recoveries, one for a touchdown by Adam McCrory, and only six total first downs. Jesuit dominated the second half scoring with four touchdowns, three rushing and one defensive score. Bobby Eveld and Rusty Davis both had one yard plunges for touchdowns while Miles Bennett scored from twelve yards out. Miles Bennett twelve yard touchdown run was part of a historic night for him and his extended family. Mile's grandfather is the coaching legend that Middleton's stadium is named after. Mile's grandfather Abe was in the stands Friday night to witness Mile's touchdown and nine carries for seventy six yards. The 42-17 win sets up a showdown with the St. Pete Catholic Barons this Friday night for the district runner-up playoff spot.
