The Tigers drained 12 three-pointers and were led by Jack Delp's amazing 6 for 7 performance and Ryan Weir's clutch threes with under a minute to go in the game. Joe Pesansky and the Tiger defense kept Naples quiet in the closing seconds. Pesansky had 16 points and 9 rebounds and Will Butler added 10 big points. The 25-4 Tigers now advance to the State Tournament semifinals and play Pembroke Pines Charter Christian on Thursday at 4pm in Lakeland.
- On Friday night before a boisterous Blue Tide at Corral Memorial Stadium, the defending state champion soccer team advanced one step closer to a repeat by defeating Stanton Prep 2-1. Down 1-0 at half, the Tigers roared back in the first two minutes of the second half with Aris Pantzalis burying a game-tying goal. With less than 15 minutes left, Ty Cabassa was brought down in the box setting up a PK for Baylen Young. Young's conversion put the Tigers up for good and Philip Falcon held steady in goal for the state semifinal win. The team now advances to the state championship on Saturday in DeLand for an all-Jesuit final as the Tigers take on Belen Jesuit of Miami.
