JESUIT HIGH SCHOOL PROFILE 2021-2022

SCHOOL COMMUNITY

Established in 1899, Jesuit High School of Tampa is a college preparatory school for male students in grades 9-12. Enrollment is limited to approximately 825 students, all of whom commute to Jesuit from throughout a five-county area of greater Tampa Bay. This year, the Jesuit student body is comprised of 34.5% students of color, and 35% of our students benefit from \$2.8 million in financial aid.

SELECTIVE ADMISSION

Applications to Jesuit High School endure a highly competitive admissions process. Very few transfer students are accepted, in the interest of cultivating a cohesive four-year experience of formation for our students.

JESUIT FAITH TRADITION

As the Jesuit axiom Ad Majorem Dei Gloriam ("For the Greater Glory of God") indicates, our Catholic faith governs every aspect of a student's formation at Jesuit High School. As such, each Jesuit student is required to study four full years of intensive academic Theology: Introduction to Catholicism, Sacred Scripture, Christian Morality, and Theological Disputations & Christian Discipleship. Additionally, students must make one retreat per academic year.

STUDENT LIFE AT JESUIT

Jesuit students benefit from a vibrant campus life outside the classroom with access to over 40 dynamic student-led organizations. Athletes compete on 12 varsity sports teams, or cheer on their brothers as members of the Blue Tide student supporters.

Faith: Retreats are planned and led by student members of Peer Ministry who provide their peers guidance for essential personal growth. Altar Servers assist extensively during regular school Mass. Members of the selective Agmen Christi are invited based on qualities of servant leadership, and engage in rigorous weekly formation seminars while also fulfilling extra service expectations under the leadership of the school's President.

Service: Members of Pro Life Club, Key Club, Students Against Destructive Decisions (SADD), the Environmental Club, and the Generous Order of Needed Services (GOONS) all work to serve both the school and the local community through their focus on specific issues related to their respective causes.

Academic Interest and Pre-professional: Students explore their intellectual passions more deeply through organizations such as the Academic Quiz Bowl, Book Club, Engineering Club, Model United Nations, Mu Alpha Theta (Math), National Honor Society, Robotics, Speech & Debate, and The Company (Business Club).

Performing and Fine Arts: Students engaged in the arts find additional opportunities to pursue their crafts through the Jesuit Tiger News Network, the Tiger Newspaper, the Lyre creative writing quarterly, the Masque drama club, Pep Band, Chamber Orchestra, Chorus, Guitar Ensemble, Don't Feed the Artists art club, and the Yearbook.

GRADING AND CLASS RANK

Jesuit High School does not rank students, nor is a GPA distribution provided. At graduation each year, a valedictorian and salutatorian are recognized for the sole purpose of honoring academic achievement. Each transcript provides a cumulative weighted GPA. Our weighted GPA calculation adds 0.5 to each Honors course, and adds 1.0 to each AP course, provided the semester grade is C or higher. Final semester grades are in the form of a full letter grade, with no +/- added.

HONORS AND AP COURSES

Honors and AP Courses are not offered through an open enrollment process. Students may self-advocate to be placed into a class at the next-highest level of rigor if they seek a more challenging experience than their initial placement provides, but not all such requests are granted. All students enrolled in an AP class are required to take the corresponding AP exam.

In the Jesuit spirit of *cura personalis*, or “care for the whole person,” students work with their counselors to evaluate their entire schedule of extracurricular activities, jobs, family responsibilities, and/or service commitments. Often this means students are encouraged to limit their selection of AP courses. Though we of course encourage students to seek challenges, we also educate students to recognize that well-rounded balance and a sustainable schedule are necessary for deep mastery of academic material and long-term success.

Please note: only one AP course is available to eligible freshmen (Human Geography), and only one AP course is available to eligible sophomores (World History).

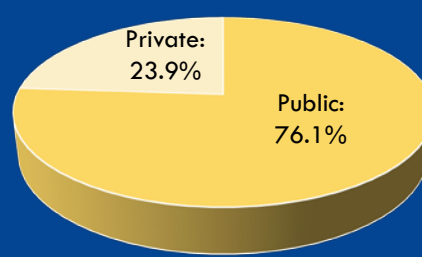
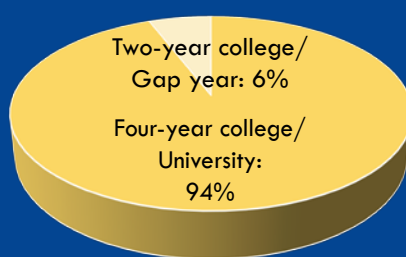
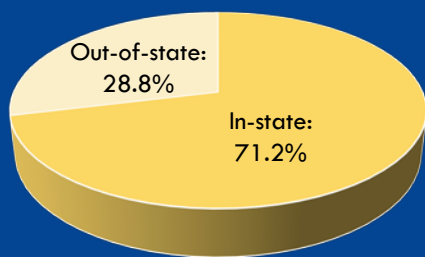
