



## Support to Sustain Jesuit's Future

**J**oe Caballero '86 is fully invested in Jesuit. Caballero invests his time and expertise in the organizations that help guide Jesuit and plan the future of the school, such as the Board of Trustees and Foundation.

And he also has invested in Jesuit financially, though gifts, donations, and as a member of the school's Bequest Society, by naming Jesuit in his will.

"I have Jesuit as one of the key beneficiaries in my will and of my trusts," Caballero said. "I believe this method of support allows for a means of giving to the institution in the future and providing for the financial needs of my family currently. It was a great way to supplement my current giving and establish a long-term plan to provide support to the school and its mission."

For Caballero, like many alums, there is a gratitude for his Jesuit experience. And since Caballero lives in Tampa – he is president and CEO of GulfShore Bank – and has remained so connected to the school (his brother, John Caballero '92, is the school's Director of IT), he sees firsthand that same influence happening today.

"My goal in supporting Jesuit, both now and in the future, is to provide assistance in sustaining the significant impact the school makes on the young men," said Caballero, a Florida State graduate with five brothers who also graduated from Jesuit. "It is very clear to me that my experience at Jesuit was a critical part of my formation spiritually as a man. I see an environment at the school today that
